## Judith Roth to demonstrate pastels at our September 17th meeting at 7 PM in Grayslake.



We are very fortunate to have Chicago artist Judith Roth start off our new season of the Lake County Art League. She will be using pastels and will be working from a live model.

Judith says that her work involves the precarious balancing of realistic and abstract expression. When successful they intensify each other. The one draws you into its illusion of depth, weight, and the raw grace of human form, and the other makes you dramatically aware of the process of paint and drawing materials being moved about on a two-dimensional surface.

Raw edges, the feeling of life and process which exists in an unfinished study, the use of space in which the silence – that which is left unspoken – are allowed to manifest themselves articulately as the completed image. These have become basic elements of her work. The medium and techniques used vary, but most of her work itself deals with the abstract essence of the human form and its poetic interpretation.

Judith has exhibited widely including Butler Institute of American Art, Youngstown, OH; Maier Museum of Art, Lynchburg, VA; National Academy of Design, NY; and J. Rosenthal Fine Arts, Ltd., Chicago. She has a large body of work currently on view at the Berman Center, a women's health and wellness facility, at 211 E. Ontario St. in Chicago. Currently an affiliate member of **ARC Gallery**, Judith is represented by the **Maple Avenue Gallery** in Evanston, IL and **Morpho Gallery** in Chicago.

## Fall Membership Show adds a prize...

Plan to submit an entry to our popular Fall Membership Show at the Jack Benny Center for the Arts in Waukegan. The show will conclude with a Monday, November 17, critique from 7:00 to 9:30 pm. The show will be critiqued by Kathy Chambers who will discuss all entries and award ribbons for **Best of Show, First Place through Third Place, and Honorable Mentions**. This year, however, there will an exciting additional prize: **David Adler Music and Art Center** in Libertyville will separately review entries and invite five artists to collectively display a sampling of their work for three weeks in February.

Amy Williams, Program Director for the Adler center, will check out the Fall Membership Show submittals in late October, and after the critique five artists will be contacted and asked to exhibit in Libertyville. A knowledgeable artist friend will assist her, and their selection will be narrowly based around a common theme, method or design that they find in the displayed art. They will be asking artists to show 5 to 8 paintings, photographs, or 3-dimensional art from February 8 to February 28, with an artist's reception on February 8 from 7:00 to 9:00 pm. Artists will asked to provide refreshments and to pay a 25% commission on sales. The center will provide music and entertainment for the evening, as well as press, newsletter, and *Facebook* publicity for the show and reception. Their marquee on Milwaukee Ave. will note the event.

**Submit your Fall Membership Show entry from 10:00 am to 1:00 pm on Saturday, October 6. You can drop off your work through Friday of the following week if that Saturday is a problem, but remember that wall space limits us to 44 entries, plus additional small three-dimensional works in the glass display case.**

There are several rules:

- Members are allowed to display only one piece
- Current dues must be paid
- Work should be wired for hanging
- Work must have been completed within the past three years
- Work must not have been in a previous Spring or Fall Membership Show

Please use discretion when picking your entry. Art that is offensive by its ethnic, religious, political, or sexual expression puts the Waukegan Park District in a very awkward position and will be removed. The Jack Benny Center is located at 39 Jack Benny Drive. This short road is the second entrance to Bowen Park off of Sheridan Road as you go north from Greenwood Avenue, and the center is located at the far end.

# Waukegan Arts Council

The **Waukegan Arts Council** is a new non-profit arts organization formed for artists, art lovers, and arts groups. Its purpose is to provide a forum to network, collaborate, educate, and promote the arts in Waukegan. Membership in the organization is intended to bring many diverse individuals and groups interested in the arts in our community under one umbrella. A group of dedicated volunteers currently form the WAC Executive Board and several influential members of the community serve as an Advisory Board.

Waukegan has had a long-standing tradition in the arts. The **Lake County Art League** began in Waukegan and had its first show in the Karcher Hotel. This long vacant building is now being renovated into 36 affordable "live/work" spaces for artists and their families. An additional 2,400 square feet will be available on the ground floor for complementary small businesses and non-profit organizations. **Artspace Waukegan** began accepting applications on August 27! Occupancy is scheduled for the end of this year. It is anticipated that this \$12.5 M project will help nurture an emerging arts community while bringing renewed vitality to downtown Waukegan.

The **Waukegan Park District** also has been at the forefront of the Waukegan arts movement for many years with its Cultural Arts Division. Theater, Symphony and Chorus, arts classes, and exhibits are just a few of the opportunities offered by the park district. A \$23 M renovation re-opened the historic Genesee Theatre in December 2004. A wide variety of performances have come to this beautifully restored theater, including comedians, the ballet, and other dance groups, Broadway musicals, film festivals, and musicians of many musical genres. March 2011 saw the re-initiation of **ArtWauk**, a monthly event (third Saturday) that showcases the growing arts community in downtown Waukegan. Several new galleries and another professional theater, **Clockwise**, have sprouted in downtown Waukegan.

Mayor Robert Sabonjian called together a Steering Committee in the spring of 2010 to develop art-related strategies to promote economic growth in Waukegan and to make the city a better place to live, work and play. It was this committee that

recommended the formation of the **Waukegan Arts Council**. Working closely with local businesses, elected officials, artists, and arts organizations the arts council will become a catalyst for advancing the economic, social, and cultural life of Waukegan through the arts.

In the Fall of this year, the Council will be unveiling a newly designed and expanded website that will offer a community-wide calendar to cover the many art and cultural events happening each week in Waukegan. The calendar will list upcoming art exhibits, performances, tours, classes, workshops, and arts lectures. The site will also list art venues, galleries, and arts organizations, resources and opportunities for the art lover and the artist, as well as an artist registry.

For an artist, membership in **WAC** provides some great low cost benefits. Each member artist will have his/her own artist registry page which includes the artist statement, resume, bio, list of services, link to their website, contact information, and photographs or other visuals of one's work. Artists can be sorted by visual arts, literary arts, performing arts, and multi-disciplinary arts for additional reference. An artist membership is \$25 each year. Member artists will also have opportunities for additional exposure. On the home page the website will feature six revolving banners highlighting various member organizations, exhibits, gallery offerings, etc. The home page SPOTLIGHT section will feature a selected member artist, venue, gallery, or other arts organization with an in-depth interview that will run continuously for a two month period.

The **Waukegan Arts Council** also plans to hold quarterly networking events, (the first is scheduled for October 2012) as well as quarterly educational seminars, free to members. Membership in the **WAC** will help to support all the above offerings.

## Plein Air Painting and Photography for the Coming Year

The Lake County Art League Plein Air Group meets year-round at interesting places every few Saturday mornings, usually from 9:00 to noon. Here's the schedule for this year:

- **9/15**, Buffalo Creek Forest Preserve for fall color in the grasses and shrubs.
- **10/6**, Grayslake residential street for Victoria homes, fall color in a neighborhood park.
- **10/27**, David Adler Center for fall color, sheltered from weather in a glassed-in porch if necessary.
- **11/17**, Inside, Dandelion Gallery (tentative), drop-off for plein air show.
- **12/8 or 12/15**, Reception and holiday get-together at the annual November-December Plein Air Show and Sale at the Jack Benny Center in Waukegan.
- **1/5**, Inside, CLC (very tentative), pick-up from plein air show.
- **1/26**, Inside, Field Museum (we have a standing invitation).

Session notices are generally sent out about three weeks in advance so they can be forwarded to others who might be interested. Sometimes an unscheduled opportunity is inserted with only a week's notice, usually because of exceptional weather or peaking fall color. There is no "membership," just an e-mail list of people who show up when they can to work on their craft. No dues, no officers, no meetings, no need to RSVP, but we do ask for ideas on where to paint and photograph, or how to challenge ourselves as artists. There are presently over 90 names on our e-mail notice list, with 5-15 attending any one session. Not all are members of the LCAL. Sessions conclude with a group sharing where artists identify a success and a frustration in their morning's work.
